Reason:	Significant as an intact 1970s-1980s mural depicting the history of Los Angeles along a half-mile-long stretch of Tujunga Wash in Sherman Oaks. One of the longest murals in the world, the Great Wall of Los Angeles mural (originally known as The History of California) was the first project of the Social and Public Art Resource Center (SPARC), founded by artist Judith Baca. It was designed and executed by teams of artists, historians, and local youth in multiple phases between 1976 and 1983. Although it is less than 50 years old, the mural is of exceptional importance and is therefore eligible for listing in the National Register.
